Supplies & location of the window you'll be painting will be available to pick up at City Hall October 13-16.

You may begin painting your assigned window October 14th and all painting must be completed by October 18th.

We are asking all painters to return and clean up their windows and remove the painting beginning November 1st and completing no later than November 7th.

Basic paint colors and necessary supplies will be provided.

Stow resident and local artist Kimmy Henderson will provide a tutorial on mixing paint to create colors and the process of painting on a window. The tutorial will be available on You Tube.

Calling all Stow residents: kids, parents, grandparents, and anyone in between! It's time to have some fall fun!! They say, "Everything old is new again," and that's exactly what we're going to show with this year's fall fun. We're bringing back an old favorite fall and Halloween activity, window painting, and we're looking to show everyone that Stow is truly "Tradition Centered. Future Focused."

For years young people painted the windows of the old Stow-Kent Plaza stores every fall, just in time for Halloween. The City of Stow and The Stow Arts Commission feel this nostalgic activity should be revived, with a city-wide Window Painting Event. This year's event is open to anyone of any age, and we'll paint the windows of local businesses and senior living facilities.

The City and the Arts Commission will supply the paint in several basic colors, along with all necessary supplies. Stow resident and well-known artist Kimmy Henderson will provide a tutorial on mixing paints to create more colors and explain the process of painting on window glass. The tutorial will be available on YouTube.

A preliminary sketch/drawing of what you plan to paint, along with your registration will be submitted at STOWOHIO.RECDESK.COM before October 5. Supplies and the location of the window you'll be painting will be available for pickup at Stow City Hall, October 13-16.

You may begin painting your assigned window October 14, and all painting must be completed by October 18. All painters are expected to return and remove the painting beginning November 1, and making sure everything is completed by November 7.

Window Painting is back in Stow! Be a part of a little nostalgia mixed in with the ideas and talents of today. It's a way to have Fall Fun in Stow!
