





STOW SAFETY TOWN

Sponsored by Stow Police Department – Stow Youth Services

Dear Parents,

A sad but true fact is that more children die every year from injuries than from all diseases combined. We believe that early education is one of the best and most effective tools to help reduce this troubling statistic. Safety Town is a safety education program for children who will be entering Kindergarten in the fall. Any child who will be five on or before August 1st and lives in the City of Stow is eligible to attend.

The sessions will be held for one week (M-F) for 2.5 hours per day. The curriculum is varied and includes such topics as fire safety, safety belts, pedestrian safety, bike safety, bus safety, stranger awareness, and playground safety. Safety Town employs two full-time certified teachers to plan and lead the daily educational process. They are assisted by the Education Specialists from the Stow Fire and Police Departments, as well as other outside safety experts.

Safety Town Stars is for students that have been identified with a developmental or cognitive disability and will benefit from a modified Safety Town curriculum at an age that is older than the traditional Safety Town. This program employs one certified intervention specialist to plan and lead the daily educational process. Safety Town Stars is open to students with developmental or cognitive disabilities going into first grade through high school. Students are encouraged to come to any of our sessions. We offer Safety Town Stars as an option.

SPOTLIGHT ON ADELL DURBIN PARK



Welcome to Adell Durbin Park!

This 34 acre park is a beautiful natural area in our community on the border of Stow and Munroe Falls. Adell Durbin Park is home to a large play area and playground, picnic areas, restrooms, lavish hiking trails, a wildflower meadow and lighted tennis courts. Dominant natural features of Adell Durbin Park include the Gorge (with Ledge deck), the Arboretum and Walnut Creek.

At one time, Adell Durbin Park was home to more than 100 species of trees and shrubs, both native and cultivated. Many still exist throughout the park. The gorge was initially formed by the melting glaciers as they retreated to the north over 10,000 years ago. The ledge in this gorge is composed of Sharon Sandstone Conglomerate laid down at the bottom of an ocean that was here over 350 million years ago. The deck, built by area Boy Scouts as an Eagle Scout Project, takes you right up against the ledge. The slowly moving stream is the major force that, over time, carved the surrounding gorge.

Hiking Trails

There are three separate hiking trails at Adell Durbin Park that intertwine at various points with each other. The trails are currently undergoing a refurbishment, which includes mapping, marking and redefining the trails. The refurbishment also includes repairing/ replacing the foot bridges.

Hikers Trail (Red): 1.2 miles

This trail starts at the south end of the parking lot and heads south, meanders by the far side of the tennis courts, along the inside of the wildflower meadow, into an open area of the park, and then into the woods for the more technical part of the trail, by the overlook and back to the parking lot.

Cliff Trail (Blue): .6 miles

This Trail starts at the west edge of the parking lot, goes a little bit south and then west, cutting into the woods and then loops around back to the parking lot after meandering through the more technical part of the trail in the woods and by the overlook.


Tree & Shrub Trail (Yellow): 1.1 miles

This trail begins at the west edge of the parking lot and heads south, meanders along the far side of the tennis courts, loops out toward Darrow Road and then back in and into an open area of the park. The trail then loops back through the center of the park and its woods, and ends at the parking lot.
